Our Catholic Identity

St. Jude Catholic School's student body is comprised primarily of students from the Roman Catholic faith tradition. However, students from all faith traditions are welcome and regularly enroll. Our children participate in liturgies that include Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Lectio Divina, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, Advent services, and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Our Faculty



Catholic Doctrine

St. Jude's goal for students is to develop the growth and excellence of each child in the knowledge of the Faith so they fall in love with the Person of Jesus Christ. They will then be prepared to change the world as disciples of Christ.

Vibrant Academic Environment

The schools in the Diocese of Peoria participate in standardized testing, which provides continuous assessment of basic educational development in grades 2-8. St. Jude Catholic School utilizes NWEA MAP testing in the Fall, Winter, and Spring to form and inform teachers' instruction and to differentiate instruction in reading, language arts, and math. Our older students are also assessed in science. St. Jude offers Academic Interventions and Enrichment to students who qualify, providing individualized instruction to meet the needs of all.

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St. Jude students model their dedication to the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy each and every day. CURRICULUM

Christ-Centered

- Each school day begins and ends in prayer, and prayer is integrated throughout the day.
- All school Masses are celebrated weekly with weekly Rosary and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to nourish and grow the spiritual life.
- Religion classes are taught daily, teaching students to know and love Catholic doctrine and witness their faith in word and deed, supported by the *Education in Virtue*° program to show how to live out their Faith.

Fostering Academic Excellence

Students at St. Jude Catholic School:

- receive a solid foundation in reading, writing, mathematics, science, social studies and STEM curricula;
- practice critical thinking, problem solving and computational skills;
- learn to appreciate the arts and participate in a dynamic music education program;
- become effective communicators who read for understanding, actively listen, write clearly and correctly, and speak effectively with confidence and poise;
- begin learning a foreign language (Spanish);
- know the importance of physical well-being;
- use information, technology and media to enhance learning.

St. Jude Catholic School offers a superior spiritual, cognitive, and social foundation that prepares students well for the next grade level. Focus on core skills in all subject areas and innovative teaching techniques keep students engaged in learning.

Virtue Formation and Discipline

Students at St. Jude learn in a disciplined, joyful Catholic culture to live and love the virtuous life. The goal of the school is to instill the practice of virtues in all our students so they can form the habits and dispositions necessary to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Growing in virtue, and therefore, happiness, is a hallmark of the education at St. Jude Catholic School utilizing the school-wide *Education in Virtue*® program.

Preschool Curriculum

St. Jude Catholic School's preschool program is based on the Illinois Early Learning Standards. Our programs offer a combination of traditional and Montessori-inspired approaches and implementation. Preschool activities support the development of early literacy and language, math, fine and gross motor skills, social and emotional development, practical life skills, and spiritual development. Weekly spiritual formation is offered in preschool with the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program.

Elementary Curriculum

St. Jude Catholic School is the parish school of St. Jude Catholic Church, and as such, is a Roman Catholic institution of the Diocese of Peoria. Thus, the spiritual, moral, intellectual, social and physical elements of education that it offers are taught within the context of the Catholic Faith. St. Jude Catholic School adheres to a well-balanced curriculum that includes (next page):

Religion. The Religion program at SJCS forms students in the Faith, giving them knowledge of the Truth. At St. Jude, we aim to instill a deep love and knowledge of the faith; love of the Church rooted in faith; formation of both intellect and will; participation in the life of the Church; awareness of and attention to social responsibilities; and development of a rich interior life. The students gain an understanding of the human need for God, learn to apply Scripture to life, use prayer daily knowing this is the primary way we grow in relationship with our Lord and are taught Catholic doctrine appropriate to their grade level, all brought to a culmination of how to live their faith by intentional formation in the virtues.

Science. The LabLearner program integrates chemistry, physics, life science, and environmental science into an elementary curriculum designed to provide the fundamental science content and develop conceptual thinking. It consists completely of hands-on observations, experiments and findings using scientific equipment.

Mathematics. The goal of math at SJCS is for students to achieve mathematical proficiency through mastery of math skills, concepts and processes. The math curriculum consists of concepts and skills taught in depth to allow for mastery with equal emphasis on conceptual understanding and fluency with skills. Use of a concrete-to-visual-to-abstract development of concepts helps to connect visual representation to problem solving, and emphasis is put on both multi-step and non-routine problem solving.

Language Arts. This broad curriculum includes reading, writing, listening, speaking, spelling, phonics, vocabulary development, handwriting and research. Each grade level curriculum emphasizes working with words, independent and guided reading, writing and communication skills. Beginning in kindergarten with phonemic awareness, decoding, pre-reading and reading, oral and written expression, the curriculum develops each year with spelling, reading fluency and comprehension, study of genres and themes, vocabulary development, handwriting, sentence structure, mechanics and grammar in writing.

Social Studies. The unique aspect of teaching Social Studies from a Catholic perspective is that the emphasis is placed on the dignity and sacredness of the human person. The students' perception of the world and its political, cultural, and religious dimensions will be shaped by the teachings of the Catholic faith with an emphasis on its social teachings. The curricular goal for Social Studies is to provide students with an accurate perception of the world and its political, cultural and religious dynamics.

Physical Education. Our goal is to teach students the fundamental importance of everyday movement through games and activity. Students learn a wide range of exercise, games and activities. Each class consists of a variety of warm-ups, group games, team sports, fitness activities, movement and motor skills.

Music. An integral part of our curriculum, students engage in active, hands-on learning activities rooted in several leading music education methods, including Solfege, Orff, Kodaly, and Music Learning Theory. Over their years at SJCS, students develop healthy singing techniques, learn to read and write music, play classroom instruments to prepare them for advanced instrumental studies, and actively participate in the music making process. We do not simply expose our students to music in hopes of fostering musical appreciation – we strive to equip them with actual musical skills. Our goal at SJCS is to help our students become competent musicians – musicians who are able to make music with their voices, on instruments, and in worship for a lifetime.

Beginning in fifth grade, students have an opportunity to explore and learn band instruments. After an informational meeting and instrument selections, students enjoy small group lessons. Entire band rehearsals are later added to help students learn ensemble playing.

Art. Each grade covers the art elements of line, color, shape and form, texture and pattern, and space according to their level. The areas of emphasis include drawing, self-expression, culture and history, artists, aesthetics and media exploration.

Foreign Language. Students at St. Jude Catholic School learn Spanish beginning in the 4-year-old program. Students start with basic Spanish greetings and words, songs and culture, and advance to reading and writing Spanish by the upper elementary grades.

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Building God's Kingdom

At St. Jude Catholic School, Christ is the Reason for our school. He is the unseen but ever present Teacher. He is the Model of its faculty and the Inspiration of its students. Spiritual Formation

The effectiveness of St. Jude's religion program relies upon daily support of religious beliefs and practices in the home. The religion program is the core of the curriculum at St. Jude Catholic School. Daily religion classes are directed toward instilling in students an understanding and appreciation for Catholic belief and practice. All students participate in classes and all religious events at St. Jude. Our beautiful school chapel is located in the junior high wing, where students may stop by to visit Jesus throughout the school day.

Each week students attend Mass (typically Friday at 8:30 a.m.) Students also attend special liturgies and prayer services for Holy Days of Obligation, special feast days, and other celebrations, The dates and times for St. Jude Catholic School Masses and prayer services are posted on the monthly school calendar and posted in the parish bulletin. Parents are always welcome to join the students and staff for Mass.

Through our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program, students build deep, lifelong relationships with Christ. These lessons are offered in a dedicated space called the Atrium, a special place of prayer, work, and study. Using age-appropriate hands-on materials, students as young as three are engaged in activities based on Sacred Scripture and the Liturgy.

Prayer is a part of the daily routine at the beginning and end of the day, before and after lunch, and throughout the day. A variety of liturgies and types of prayer are offered for students during each liturgical season throughout the school year. Students participate regularly in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Enrichment

The Enrichment Program applies a crosscurricular approach to help students develop critical thinking, creativity and problem solving skills through a variety of topics and activities. Students in the Enrichment Program have the opportunity to use the tinkercad program for 3D printing projects, as well as engaging in a variety of activities for vocabulary building, spatial visualization, critical thinking and strategy skills. First through eighth grade students are selected to participate in the program based on teacher recommendations, MAP scores, class grades, and excellent conduct reports.

Our our STEM Program (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) offers another source of enrichment for SJCS middle schoolers. Students participate in activities during the school day which offer early exposure to the health and engineering fields, inspiring them to become aware of their unique gifts and talents as they prepare for a career in the service of others. The application of our STEM program encourages students to leverage their gifts of collaboration, creativity, communication and critical thinking in a unique learning environment. This program is available to all students in fifth through eighth grades.
